CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Introduction

New Regulatory Code of Conduct for all Charity users

This code of conduct applies to all Charity user's & outlines basic standards of conduct & behaviour to protect both the charity & its users.

This Code of Conduct is to ensure that the users of the charity do not bring the charity name into disrepute.

2. General standards of conduct & Personal Behaviour

Members should conduct themselves in a way that will not bring the charity into disrepute

Members should respect the trustees and volunteers who run the charity or event(s)

Members should offer both respect & support to other charity users

Members should always act with integrity when representing the charity in public, or as a volunteer

We politely ask that members remember that all posts are confidential & as such no post/information should be shared from within this group

Any child protection issues should be reported to trustee's Melanie Battye or Paula Jones

Any other issues should be reported in the first instance to the named trustee's above or a volunteer representing the charity (if you are new to Friends Play for Disabled Children), both trustees & volunteers are easily identifiable by the pink uniform worn, with the charity logo on.

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Whilst the general use of Social Media is of no relevance to us, we wish to make it clear that the charity has a legitimate interest in the private activities of a charity user where they bring the charity into disrepute. We will regard negative or derogatory comments about the charity, in relation to its current funders, potential funders or its patron as a breach of this agreement and as a result the user(s) will no longer be allowed to access the charity and its services.

We would like to remind all parents that whilst risk assessments are conducted by either ourselves or the venue hired, the general care & safety of your children relies on your supervision.
